Brand New Book \*\*\*\*\* Print on Demand \*\*\*\*\*.Congress on November 19 voted to extend the program of Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), along with mandatory child care, transitional medicaid, and abstinence education, from December 31, 2002 through January 11, 2003, the date cited in the House November 13 resolution (H.J.Res. 124). However, on November 14, in amendments to separate bills (H.R. 5603 and H.R. 3529, respectively), both House and Senate voted to continue TANF and related funding through March 31, but these bills differed in other respects and were not reconciled. The American Public Human Services Association and the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL) have urged Congress to continue TANF for at least 3 years, through FY2005, and they have identified more than 30 provisions that they want in a final reauthorization bill. The House in May passed a 5-year extension bill (H.R. 4737), but the Senate Finance Committee substitute bill (also H.R. 4737) never reached the Senate floor. On several key issues, including work hours, work activities, and child care funding, the bills are far apart.
