Nor were things really much better in places where one would have expected to find a higher standard, for Tomline (Bishop of Lincoln)--who was Dean of St. Pauls in 1800--says, that on Easter Day of that year in that vast and noble Cathedral no more than six persons were found at the Table of the Lord. One reason, of course, of all this clerical neglect, and of the consequent indifference of the people, lay in the fact that, owing to absenteeism and pluralism, one curate often had to serve more...
